ACTIVITY NOTES

My Notes

This game can be played by your learners in pairs or in groups of three or four, or even as a whole class (but I find it works best when played in small groups of three).

First, cut up the cards before class. (If you have a class of 15 students, and plan to play with groups of three, then prepare 5 sets of cards.)

When played in groups of three, place the cards face down in the middle of the three players. One player can begin by flipping a card over and then describing the word – WITHOUT SAYING the actual word. For example:

- (A) It's red and we can put it on fries.
- (B) Is it ketchup?
- (A) Yes!

When a player correctly guesses the word on the card, he or she can keep it.

At the end of the game, when all the cards have been used, the players count all of their cards to find out who has the most cards – and who has won the game.
